Dear friends,

This Sunday, with the First Sunday of Advent, we step into the new liturgical year. But this year is a bit different from previous years. As we begin Year C, there is going to be a important change. We will be changing over to a new translation of the Lectionary, that is, the readings we hear at Mass. To put it simply, we may not notice a massive change – the narrative, message, characters and ending remains the same! What you will notice is a change in some of the words and language that we have all been so familiar with.

For a number of years, the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales have been considering the publication of a new translation of the Lectionary to replace the version originally published in 1969 (second edition 1981). After consultation with a number of English-speaking Conferences of Bishops, the Bishops of England and Wales studied the translation of the Catholic Edition of the English Standard Version (ESV) of the Bible produced by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of India. From this text they have produced a Lectionary for the Church in India which has received 'confirmatio' by the Holy See. The English Standard Version: Catholic Edition is seen as fulfilling the qualities the Church seeks when considering a translation of scripture namely: (i) The evaluation and use of source material. (ii) Accuracy of translation which conveys the meaning of the biblical authors. (iii) Dignity and accessibility of language needed for a worthy proclamation of the Word of God. The Bishops of England and Wales agreed in November 2018 that this text should be the basis for the new edition of the Lectionary to be used in their territory. I think we need to see this as an opportunity to re-engage with the scriptures. There are many times that we read a familiar piece of scripture, but how often do we think about what it actually means? Here is a chance to do that. It will allow us to think - How does this make a difference? Is there something I have been interpreting differently all this time? What is the real message here? Most importantly, what do the scriptures tell me about living a life and reaching the ultimate goal of eternal life with the Father? Let us embrace this opportunity to re-engage with the scriptures and listen to the Word of God.
