Dear Friends

Taking a break this week from the Jubilee series of thoughts, of 25 suggestions to keep the Jubilee Year of 2025, today I write a little about the appeal made in church today. Each year we have two appeals for "extra" causes. In May the Comboni Missionaries are coming to the parish, as they are to all parishes in our diocese this year.

This Sunday we take part in World Leprosy Day in association with Lepra, the international charity working with those combatting this ancient foe. For us in Europe the very idea of leprosy seems strange, although we still use the term "leper" to label anyone who is regarded as an outcast from our social groups, which is significant.

Of course, leprosy features often in the record of Holy Scripture. Think of the story of Namaan the Syrian in the history of Elisha the prophet, and it hardly needs to be said so often in the Gospel narrative Jesus frequently engages with those suffering from leprosy. The whole mission of Our Saviour was to bring reconciliation to the lost, and leprosy summed this up. A thousand years later, when leprosy still haunted Europe, a meeting with a leper was the catalyst for St Francis of Assisi to set out on his radical path to serve the Lord.

Do take a moment today or in the coming week to look at the poster in church giving more information about Lepra, or look the charity up online. Particularly it features the work of St Joseph's Leprosy centre in Indore, India, showing how the charity supports the work of the Catholic Church in healthcare.

Let us all put this cause in our prayers at this time, not least as it helps us see that the work of the Gospel, to bring the healing and reconciliation of Christ to a needy world, still needs our work, and also perhaps to reflect on what needs to be done in our own context - not combatting leprosy, but looking for other ways to be a source of healing of every kind.
