

Dear Friends.

Today Holy Church enters what is known as the *Season* of the Passion. This latter part of Lent leads up to the Great Three Days, the Sacred Paschal Triduum of Holy Thursday to Easter Sunday, which is in effect one long act of worship. The best advice I can give anyone is to put aside as many other concerns as possible during this time, and especially when we come to Holy Week to prioritise this unique time of worship. The observance of

Holy Week takes some effort and sacrifice, of time and some comfort, and this should be our priority in this one week of the year. The keeping of Holy Week feeds us and repays our efforts many times over.

This Season of the Passion is marked first by the veiling of images and statues in church. This is an ancient tradition. In one way it could be seen as an act of mourning. Mainly, though, it is a way of "clearing the decks" in a sense, to concentrate our attention on the main stage, for truly as Holy Week approaches we begin to enter into the mysteries of our redemption as it were in real time.

The next Parish Newsletter will be on the Second Sunday of Easter. There won't be a Newsletter on Palm Sunday or Easter Sunday. The schedule of worship for this period is available on the special leaflet. Mass intentions - where any have been offered - will be published on the notice board as usual. Now it is time to be with the Lord in his Passion and just spend time with him and with one another in our worship. Come to the Stations of the Cross. Come to the time of church cleaning too! Come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation either here or in another church.

At the centre of the Paschal Triduum are the solemn prayers for the church and for the world during the liturgy of Good Friday. This is our job as the Church in the world - to bring the world in all its needs: the false moves; the well-meaning errors; the chaos and waste; as well as the desires for good and right in all people - to bring all these things to the place of our redemption in the Cross of Christ.

The more we enter into the Season of the Passion, the more we will understand the wonderful days of celebration of Easter to come.
