Dear Brothers and sisters

As the year goes on, we shall find ways to enter more deeply into the meaning and the opportunity of a Jubilee Year, and especially a Jubilee Year dedicated to the theme of HOPE. It is good to trust in the providence of God that all things can work for good.

I was fascinated this week to speak with Fr Tomas at St Augustine's, our neighbour parish and to hear that not so long ago, in his capacity then as Superior General of the Augustinian order, our Holy Father Pope Leo had celebrated Mass in that church, so close to us. "Small world" we might say - but that is the point of the Church, to make our world one grace-filled community. This is our hope.

This is an Augustinian charism, based on the life and thought of St Augustine. Among all his work, Augustine developed an image of building what he called the "City of God," a civilisation of grace, in the middle of the earthly city, which was so evidently in his time falling apart as the Roman Empire crumbled. Again, "Small world" we might say. Surely we too live in a civilisation that is fragmenting and crumbling around us? God made us, St Augustine said, to make the times we live in, not to be made by the times we live in. We know the focus and the purpose of life. As we print this Newsletter we won't yet know the outcome of the vote in Parliament on the proposed legislation on assisted suicide. We hope for good sense from Parliament, but we may not get it, and things may fall apart a bit more.

These ideas are amongst those that have formed the mind and heart of the Pope God has sent us. It is a matter of HOPE that this is so. Let us pray for him as his Petrine Ministry is officially inaugurated this Sunday that he will calmly and courageously continue in the steps not just of St Peter, but also of St Augustine, and build up the Body of Christ and the City of God.

PATTERN OF WORSHIP STARTING MONDAY 9 JUNE: For the next

few weeks this will be in the Newsletter so we can all get familiar with it. The thinking is this: On one hand, according to the laws of the Church, I am only allowed to say 3 Sunday Masses, except in extraordinary circumstances. Also, our current schedule is very pressured for one priest. However, because of the size of the church and the different character of each Mass, I am reluctant to cut anything *at present*. However, the timing of Masses will have to be spread out to allow me time to meet and talk with people after Mass as much as possible and also to do practical things in preparation for our worship. The schedule is as follows:

Sunday Mass:

(6.00pm Saturday Anticipated Mass for those forced to work on Sunday) This time changes to allow Confessions before Mass instead of afterwards. 8.30am

10.00am (with Children's Liturgy)

12 Noon

6.00pm

Weekday Mass:

will continue as presently at **9.30am**, except that there will **be no Mass in the parish on Wednesdays**, except Holy Days, to allow me a day off. Saturday Mass remains at **10.00am**, followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

This pattern of worship is an experiment to see if it can be sustained. I am taking some annual leave whilst Fr Linferd is still here. In the future when it is appropriate for me to be on leave, some changes will have to be made to this schedule depending on the "cover" arrangements that can be made.

The other important practical change to our usual arrangements will be the times that the church building is open for private prayer. As far as possible the church will open as usual at 8am on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, and close on those days at 6pm. On Saturday we will open at 9am and Sunday at 7.30am, closing after the last Mass on those days. *On Wednesdays at present, I regret, the church will be closed.* On all weekdays, when nobody is present on site the building will be closed. At all such times a notice will be posted in the side door window with relevant information.
