HABEMUS PAPAM

After days and weeks of speculation, the name of our new Pope was announced on 8th May 2025 - Cardinal Robert Prevost who has taken the name Pope Leo XIV. There are a few firsts associated with him. He is the first Pope from North America. He is the first Augustinian Pope. He was also twice elected prior general, of the Augustinian religious order, the 13th century order founded by St. Augustine.



Born on September 14, 1955, in Chicago, Illinois, Pope Leo XIV pursued a path of religious service early on, joining the Order of Saint Augustine. His academic journey included a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics from Villanova University, a Master of Divinity from Catholic Theological Union, and a doctorate in Canon Law from the Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aguinas. His missionary work took him to Peru, where he served in various capacities, including parish pastor, seminary teacher, and diocesan official. His deep connection to Latin America and fluency in multiple languages positioned him as a bridge between cultures within the global Church. In 2015, he was appointed Bishop of Chiclayo, Peru. Pope Francis promoted him to archbishop in 2023 and to cardinal in 2024.

His election has been well accepted with widespread optimism about his potential to unite diverse communities and address global challenges. As the faithful chant "Viva il Papa!" the world watches to see how Pope Leo XIV will shepherd the Church into a new era. Let us keep our Holy Father in our prayers as he shoulders the responsibility of being the vicar of Christ.

PATTERN OF WORSHIP: I wrote on the front of last week's Newsletter that, sadly, when we no longer have Fr Linferd with us in the parish after Pentecost Sunday, there won't automatically be another priest coming to the parish. Therefore the pattern of Sunday and Weekday Masses will have to be what can be sustained regularly by one priest. This is really difficult. On one hand, according to the laws of the Church, I am only allowed to say 3 Sunday Masses, except in extraordinary circumstances. Also, our current schedule is very pressured for one priest. However, because of the size of the church and the different character of each Mass, I am reluctant to cut anything *at present*. However, the timing of Masses will have to be spread out to allow me time to meet and talk with people after Mass as much as possible and also to do practical things in preparation for our worship. I will talk more about this at Mass but at present the schedule will be as follows:

Sunday Mass:

(6.00pm Saturday Anticipated Mass for those forced to work on Sunday) This time changes to allow Confessions before Mass instead of afterwards.

8.30am

10.00am (with Children's Liturgy)

12 Noon

6.00pm

Weekday Mass:

will continue as presently at 9.30am, except that there will be no Mass in the parish on Wednesdays, except Holy Days, to allow me a day off. Saturday Mass remains at 10.00am, followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

This pattern of worship is an experiment to see if it can be sustained. I am taking some annual leave whilst Fr Linferd is still here. In the future when it is appropriate for me to be on leave, some changes will have to be made to this schedule depending on the "cover" arrangements that can be made.

The other important practical change to our usual arrangements will be the times that the church building is open for private prayer. As far as possible the church will open as usual at 8am on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, and close on those days at 6pm. On Saturday we will open at 9am and Sunday at 7.30am, closing after the last Mass on those days. On Wednesdays we will open when staff are present on site. On all weekdays, when nobody is present on site the building will be closed. At all such times a notice will be posted in the side door window with relevant information.
