"Simon, Son of John, do you love me?...Feed my sheep" In these words from the Gospel for this Sunday the Risen Jesus gives his commission to Peter, the leader of the Apostles and so to be our first Pope. All the resurrection appearances recorded in the Gospels reveal to us that this most extraordinary and wonderful event, the centre of all of history, happened whilst ordinary life carried on from day to day. The point is the Resurrection of Jesus transforms all these things.

So ordinary life and its challenges carries on today. This week the Conclave meets to elect a new Pope, another in that long line of 2000 years to be given this special commission to "feed my sheep." The power of the Resurrection fills this moment with the new reality. Maybe next Sunday we will have a new Holy Father! Pray fervently for the Cardinals as they meet. The needs of the Church in all the local circumstances around the world carries on, and we will learn something of this from our Mission Appeal at Mass this Sunday in the work of the Comboni Fathers.

In each of our lives ordinary life continues. How will we allow the Resurrection of Jesus to fill all these things? In the life of our parish, as mentioned at Mass last Sunday, we are sad now to be saying goodbye to Fr Linferd. His last Sunday with us is Pentecost, 8th June. More about this in the coming weeks.

I mentioned last Sunday I would say more about what Fr Linferd's departure for his home diocese means for us. Well, first I have been told that there cannot be a replacement for him in the immediate future. Where we now have assistant diocesan clergy available, they are needed in larger parishes than ours. It is possible in the future that a student priest doing studies in London might be able to come to help us in the way Fr Linferd has, but these priests are now scarce because fewer visas are granted for this purpose. So at present I will be the only priest in this parish, with Deacon Wayne to help. The immediate practical issue to address is the provision of Sunday Mass, and weekday Mass also, in a way that one priest can sustain. I will write more about this next week. For now, the important thing is that Christ is Risen!
