

While we can take care of our mental and spiritual development, it's important to also nurture our bodies. Review how you exercise - even if it's a speedy 10-minute daily walk - eat better (i.e. cut out the bad stuff a bit), review how to sleep enough. There's a serious point here: our bodies are Temples of the Holy Spirit, and taking proper care is an act of gratitude to God for the gift of life. Taking control a bit here means giving proper control to God!

16) RECONNECT WITH NATURE

We often talk about the importance of getting out into the great outdoors. The benefits are endless. Whether it's hiking, gardening, or simply walking to the local park, let the beauty of creation renew your spirit. The point is to make a definite plan, even for an occasional outing.

17) MENTOR SOMEONE YOUNGER

Not so easy, this one, but worth looking for opportunities. The world changes so quickly and for young people – teens, and those in their 20s, or even older!- it can be comforting to have the wisdom of someone older to reassure them. Therefore, try talking about your faith with a younger person in your family, parish, or workplace. Jubilee point here: you are possibly undervaluing what a resource you are for the Gospel!
