"In a hospital room in Ashdod, Israel, 22-year-old Suhail Abo Dawood smiles through pain. Just days ago, he was caught in an Israeli attack that hit the Holy Family parish in Gaza. Now, recovering from multiple surgeries after shrapnel tore through his body, Suhail clings not to bitterness, but to something more radical: love. "Peace will return to Gaza," he tells L'Osservatore Romano, the Vatican newspaper, "...because love is stronger than war." Suhail's words are not naive optimism. They are forged in suffering. As missiles struck the compound of Gaza's only Catholic parish, Suhail was inside. It is a place he considers home - where faith, family, and community help him make sense of a world unraveling around him.

The violence shattered that fragile sanctuary, but amid the wreckage, he survived. He was taken out of Gaza that night and to a hospital in Ashdod, a rare transfer made possible only by the intervention of Catholic leaders on both sides of the border. Fr Gabriel Romanelli, the parish priest of Holy Family, had been in contact with Suhail's mother, Randa. "We prayed that he would live," she said. "And he did. God has given him back to us," Though still weak, Suhail insisted on meeting the Vatican reporter who visited him. "We always said we'd meet in Rome or Gaza when peace comes," he joked. "I never imagined it would be here, in a hospital room." Suhail is a student of literature and a thoughtful Catholic voice in the Holy Land. Recently he wrote about life inside the parish compound where families have been living communally since the war began. "We share almost everything," he wrote, "including the food the Church gives us." "Three weeks ago, a grandmother named Magy died of a sudden illness. She had been strong through 10 months of war. Her death surprised and saddened us." He remembers her as honest, loyal, and deeply devout - she never missed Mass and always held her rosary in hand.

"We often see children and the elderly here praying together, playing, laughing. These relationships between generations are still strong here in our parish, and throughout the Middle East." To support the Christians of the Holy Land visit acnuk.org or friendsoftheholyland.org.uk. Fr James

### IMPORTANT PERSONAL NEWS FROM DEACON WAYNE:

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I write to let you know that I will be stepping away from my ministry as a permanent Deacon at St Thomas of Canterbury from September. I will be staying on as Catechist Co-ordinator.

I have served at St Thomas' in one capacity or another for over 30 years, 20 years as the Master of Ceremonies (MC) and nearly seven as a Deacon. I have recently been looking through my family history and their connection with the parish. My maternal grandparents were married here in 1942 and well as my own parents in 1968 and of course my own marriage.

As you can imagine this decision has not been an easy one to make, but after a period of prayer and reflection and my ongoing health problems, I believe this decision is the right one for me at this time and it is entirely my own decision. As of yet I do not know what the next chapter in my ministry will look like, but as soon as those discussions have taken place with the Bishop I will of course let you know.

It goes without saying, I have so many people to thank for my time in ministry here, especially Fr Dennis who gave me such wonderful support when I made the decision to put myself forward to become a deacon, his guidance and support are something which I will be forever grateful for and of course Fr Linferd who I miss immensely, as I said before he was more than just a colleague, he will always be a true friend. I would also like to thank all the wonderful priests I have had the honour of working with here at St Thomas' including Fr James who has the difficult job being the only priest here now and finally a heartfelt thank you to you, for your support, sitting through my preaching, and your love and support you have always shown me.

Whilst a deacon here, I have conducted over 35 baptisms, 2 weddings and numerous funerals. I pray that my ministry here has made a difference to the life of the parish, however small that may be.

My final mass as a Deacon will be on the 7<sup>th</sup> September, I will of course continue to pray for you and I hope you will pray for me in the next chapter of my diaconal ministry.
