Catechesis with Deacon Wavne:

The sacraments are the heart of Catholic life, channels through which Christ's grace is truly given to believe the Church. They matter bear tymbols symbols or rituals, but visible signs that confer the grace they signify, forming and strengthening the faithful as members of the Body of Christ. In Catholic thinking, grace is God's life present in the soul, and the sacraments are



concrete means by which this divine life is communicated, nourished, and deepened.

First, sacraments integrate believers with Christ and with each other. Through Baptism, one is cleansed of original sin, incorporated into the Church, and welcomed as a child of God. Confirmation corroborates this baptismal grace, strengthening the Spirit's gifts so that the faithful can witness to Christ in daily life. The Eucharist, the summation of the sacraments, unites believers with Christ and with one another as they share in the real presence of Jesus under the appearances of bread and wine. This communion helps builds a communal, missionary people. Second, sacraments sustain the Christian life. Reconciliation offers forgiveness, healing, and the restoration of grace after sin. Anointing of the Sick provides spiritual strength, comfort, and sometimes physical grace, especially for the seriously ill or elderly. Holy Orders and Matrimony configure individuals to specific vocations within the Church, sanctifying service and family life as a vocation love and Third, sacraments reveal the mystery of God's unconditional love. They are signs of a reality beyond themselves, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church.

Fourth, sacraments sanctify time and space. They sanctify the rhythms of life birth, growth, illness, marriage, death—by infusing ordinary moments with divine meaning. The Church's liturgical calendar, centred on the sacraments, shapes the calendar of grace: Sundays, feast days, and seasons become occasions for grace to be received anew, transforming ordinary life into a continual encounter with the Deacon Wayne divine.

The Cardinal asks every parish to review our Planned Giving every few years to take into account changed circumstances for households and promote efficient ways to provide for our needs. If possible please complete the form today at Mass. The Bowden Room will be available for time after Mass too.

Here's some information to address some frequently asked questions:

1) What do we contribute financially to the diocese?

This is worked out by a formula taking our "assessable" income from two years previous. For 2023 that figure was £187.574. The formula means we contribute 33% of that to central services (Education; HR; IT; Safeguarding, Property Services etc etc). Currently we pay £5158 a month.

2) What is our weekly income?

In the past a note had been put in the Newsletter with the total of that week's Offertory. At present this isn't the case because the figure had become inaccurate. As the use of Standing Orders and Contactless payments increases, data is collected at different times, not just week by week. As office time allows, the intention is to publish a monthly figure for Offertory income. The full parish accounts are published each year and a summary displayed on the noticeboard.

PRAYING THE ROSARY IN OCTOBER: Pope Leo has asked all the faithful to pray the Rosary in October for the cause of peace. He said: "Dear brothers and sisters, the month of October is now approaching, and in the Church it is dedicated in a special way to the Holy Rosary. Therefore, I invite everyone, every day of the coming month, to pray the Rosary for peace: personally, in the family & the community."
