"...serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received" - 1 Peter 4:10


Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Every few years a parish, like any household, is wise to take stock of its resources. That's what this Planned Giving campaign is about. It is also what a Jubilee Year is for: to look at where we are and make plans for the future. We last fully reviewed our stewardship 15 years ago. Since then we've all faced the challenges of the pandemic, the cost of living crisis, and of so many changes which are always unsettling. Our parish has also faced unhelpful changes to rules that affect us as a charity and a listed building.

Is this about money? Well, I'll be very straightforward with you and say: Yes, that's a big part of it. Its about making the most of our money. Over the next two weeks you'll hear about various ways to support our parish. I ask that you listen with an open mind and consider what might be an option for you and your family.

To nurture our faith and life:


The heart of all we do is our worship. To grow in prayer and devotion, learn and know our faith, care for one another and witness to that faith are all strands we weave together to make a parish. To strengthen each strand and allow the talents and gifts of all to flourish means investing in human, technological and artistic assets.

Securing the long-term care of our church:

20 years ago, so much great work was done to renovate our unique church and heritage and this was done by a special campaign and a one-off selling of assets. More and more we need to protect the fruits of all that hard work and keep ahead of maintenance by wise investment and wise spending, building financial resilience. (Not forgetting the Cemetery and No.62 too!)

Opening the doors:

To be the Church means having a mission to make the Catholic Faith available to the different people who come into our buildings and live around us. To be able to be a beacon of Christ, to "wave the flag", to hold events, make community opportunities and sustain a mission takes planning and resources from a reliable income.



What does this Parish church mean to me?

As Stewards of this Parish, we are each responsible for the upkeep of our Parish, with a duty to pass it on to future generations in even better condition than when we received it.

What you decide to give is personal to you. Traditionally, communities of the faithful tithed, giving 10% of their income. Some like to break this down into '5 and 5':

- 5 hours of service to Parish ministry (sharing your time, talents and prayer)
- 5% of their income.

Whatever you decide, the amount should suit your circumstances and be meaningful to you. The table below can help you to work out suggested weekly giving percentages, that you can change or adjust at any time.
