Using our space:

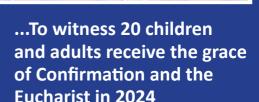
- Planning the facilities and maintenance of our site – the hall space in No. 62, Bowden Room, cemetery and the forecourt.

A stitch in time: why maintenance of our Church building matters...

Our church is beautiful and it enriches our worship, and enhances the quality of life of our parishioners. Quite simply it is cherished. We look after this church not only for us, but for our children, and their children, so that they are able to inherit this beautiful sanctuary.

(From Asset Survey) Over the coming 5 years we are anticipating that we will need to spend £250,000 on just regular maintenance. This work includes:

- Repairs to the South Porch and guttering problems £10,000
- Renewing the sound system £20,000
- Upgrading the Confessional space for Safeguarding £30,000
- Mending the 1840s heritage windows in the Presbytery £20,000
- Renewing the Presbytery/Bowden Room kitchen £10,000
- Remedial works to rental properties (Costs being assessed now)

(There's also renewing the lighting in church, which you'll hear about separately as we have substantial funding for this already.)

The graph above shows the fluctuation of offertory collections since 2018.

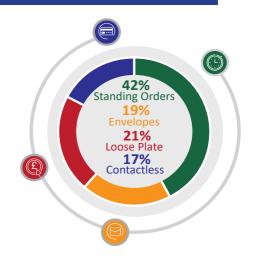
GiftAid is easy to do, it doesn't cost you a penny and helps the parish even further!
