What is **Red Wednesday?**

Red Wednesday this year is this week, on Wednesday 19 November. For example, everyone at our school is encouraged to wear something red that day. Many church and public buildings will be floodlit in red during the evening. These are just a few of the many events taking place around the country.



Red Wednesday is the initiative of Aid to the Church in Need - a charity that needs little introduction to us here at St Thomas's - and which provides unique and effective practical and spiritual support to Catholic and other Christian communities around the world wherever our brothers and sisters are persecuted for the name of Jesus. The need for this work is extensive, shocking and growing. Visit ACNUK.ORG to find out more. To speak personally, I saw the work of ACN at first hand when in 2019 I travelled to Iraq for the ordination of the new Archbishop Of Mosul, who had been previously working here in Hammersmith & Fulham. Real help where it is most needed, providing schools, resources and funding vital to keep the Church alive after the devastation of ISIS.

Red Wednesday is very simply a day of witness and prayer to raise awareness in our society of the plight of our fellow Catholics in so many different countries and situations. The event was first held only nine years ago in 2016, and has grown into a national event. Above all, of course, it is a day of prayer and worship, but also of different fund-raising and publicity initiatives.

In our parish, many of you already have a connection with ACN through previous appeals in church, and we hope to be selling Christmas cards for the charity again this year too. I urge you to visit the website (as above) to see what more you can do. The *Red Wednesday* event in London this year is at St George's Cathedral in Southwark (details inside this Newsletter) for an evening filled with prayer and music under the glow of red light, centred on Holy Mass offered for persecuted Christians gathering at 5.30pm for 6pm. In a Jubilee year, we pray for all this as Pilgrims of Hope.

PILGRIM MASS AT CATHEDRAL: As the Holy Year/Jubilee nears its close there will be a Pilgrim Mass in Westminster Cathedral at 2 pm on Saturday 22 Nov. This Mass is open to all, with its theme of pilgrimage appealing to those who have walked the Westminster Way during the year, but also completed other pilgrimages (walking and otherwise), and those who would have liked to have gone on a pilgrimage but have not been able to do so. Westminster Cathedral is itself one of our Jubilee Churches, so the journey there on 22 November could be considered a pilgrimage in itself.

OLIVE WOOD CARVINGS FROM THE HOLY LAND: The Good Shepherd Company from the Holy land (Bethlehem), based in Nottingham will be visiting the weekend of **29-30 NOVEMBER.** This work supports the Christian families in the Holy Land to stay at work. Olive wood carving is one of the most important sources of income for them, as 90% of the Christians rely on this sale. Selling their produce here on their behalf helps prevent Christians from leaving the country in search of work.

We also hope to be selling Christmas Cards in aid of *Aid to the Church* in *Need* - more news of this as we know it.
